

ORDINANCE NO. 60

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PERSONS FROM PLACING OR ALLOWING TO BE PLACED PAPER, LITTER, TRASH, TIN CANS, BOTTLES ETC. UPON ANY STREET ALLEY, SIDEWALK, SQUARE, LOT OR OTHER PREMISES IN THE CITY OF PETROLIA, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PETROLIA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. If any person shall place, throw or deposit any paper, trash, waste, rubbish, sweepings, refuse, litter, tin cans, bottles or scraps of any kind or material into or upon any street, alley, sidewalk, square, lot or other premises in this city, he or she shall be deemed guilty of committing a nuisance, which is hereby made a penal offense, a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction by due process of law, be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars, (\$100.00).

SECTION 2. The fact that there is no ordinance on the above subject at the present time creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the rules requiring ordinances to be read upon more than one day be suspended, and the same is hereby suspended, and that this ordinance take effect from and after its passage, and it is so ordained.

THE ABOVE AND FOREGOING ORDINANCE WAS PRESENTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PETROLIA, TEXAS AT A REGULAR MEETING IN THE CITY HALL OF SAID CITY ON THE FIRST DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1966 WHERE A MOTION WAS MADE BY ALDERMAN RANDALL AND SECONDED BY ALDERMAN FINCHER THAT THE SAME BE ADOPTED, AND THE MOTION WAS SUBMITTED TO DISCUSSION AFTER WHICH THERE WERE FIVE VOTES FOR

AND NO VOTES AGAINST SAME, AND THE MAYOR PRESIDING DECLARED  
THAT THE MOTION HAD PREVAILED AND THAT IT WAS SO ORDERED.
